Students will be given credit for the content of this named course but credits will not count towards the 40 credit minimum of upper division (3xxx) credits required in all programs at UMC.


Vermilion Community College and the University of Minnesota, Crookston are committed to

- (3) working in partnership to create programs and services of superior value to students, industries, communities, and the State of Minnesota.


