# Gary Senske Endowment Fund Supports UMC Men's Basketball

Gary Senske, former head coach of men's basketball was recognized for his contributions to the University of Minnesota, Crookston (UMC) on Wednesday, December 10, during halftime at the men's basketball game and at a social at the Crookston Eagles following the game. The announcement of the Gary Senske Endowment Fund was also a part of that recognition. The endowment will provide support for UMC Men's Basketball scholarships.

UMC Teambackers kicked off the endowment with a \$500 check to the fund. Athletic Director, Stephanie Helgeson said, "It was a wonderful evening and Gary was very appreciative of all the faculty, staff, friends and family that came to wish him well. We have established a Gary Senske Endowment in recognition of his service and dedication to the University."

Senske was UMC's head men's basketball coach for 21 years, from 1981 to 2002. At UMC his NJCAA teams compiled 176 wins against 117 losses for a 61% win-loss record that included 12 consecutive winning seasons, a division championship, four division runners-up, a State Championship, and a Region XIII runner-up title. He and his wife Carol currently reside in Perham, MN.

# Mike and Barbara Menzhuber Establish Memorial Scholarship

Mike and Barbara Menzhuber have established a scholarship in Mike's parents', William and Ruth, memory. The scholarship honors the legacy that the Menzhuber family has with the University of Minnesota, Crookston (UMC). NWSA/UMC was a big part of my family's life. As a family, they attended NWSA and UMC sporting events, concerts and special programs. Mike says, "The first basketball game my brother Bob and I ever saw, and the first concert we ever attended, were at the NWSA."

William (Bill) began working at UMC in 1955 when it was still the Northwest School of Agriculture (NWSA). He was a teacher in the Agricultural Engineering department and the Carpentry Club advisor. Students fondly remember Bill as very kind, and as one of his former students puts it, "a very gracious man and inspiring." Bill also did buildings and grounds work for the NWSA during the summers and, when the college first opened in 1966, Bill was appointed the school's first Director of Physical Plant Services. Bill continued to serve the college as the Director of Physical Plant Services until his death in 1983.

Bill's tireless commitment to the college would not have been possible without the strong support he received from Ruth. In addition to sharing Bill's vision for the college, Ruth had a history of her own with UMC. When the college's first graduating class entered school in the fall of 1967, Ruth was the bookstore manager. She also taught in the Physical Education program. In addition, Ruth was involved for many years with the Red River Valley Winter Shows providing administrative support in her position as Dr. B. E. Youngquist's assistant.

The scholarship endowment that Mike and his wife, Barbara, are establishing honors Bill and Ruth's commitment and contribution to the campus. According to Mike, "We are just doing what my parents would have wanted done. They took great pride in the college and they would have done anything to support its continue growth and development. By establishing a scholarship endowment in their name, as long as there is a University of Minnesota, Crookston, my parents will be able to contribute their support."

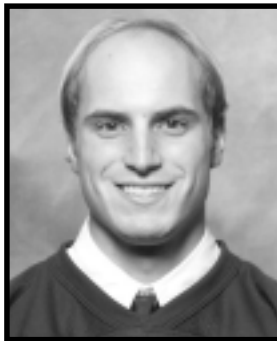

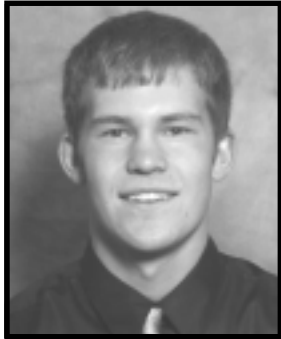

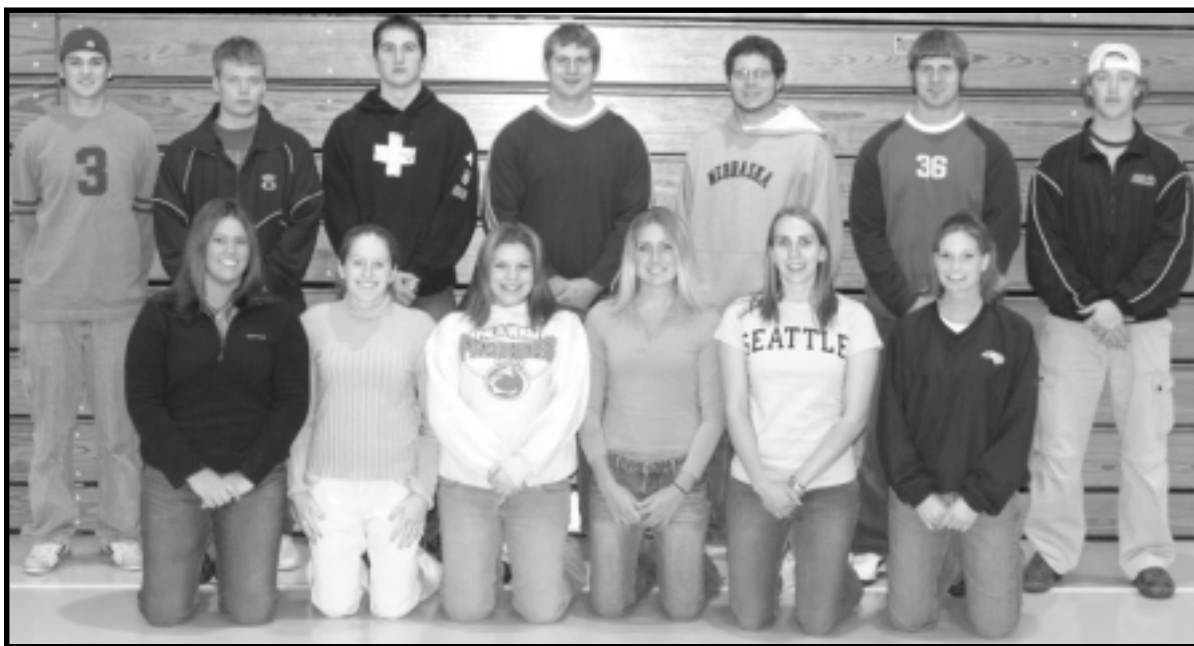

*Minneapolis, Minn.* -- The Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference has announced its Fall All-Academic Teams for the fall athletic season. To be eligible for this honor, the student-athlete must be a member of the varsity traveling team and have a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or better. Furthermore, the student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic and athletic standing at the institution represented with one full year completed at that particular institution.

The University of Minnesota, Crookston had 15 of its student athletes that competed in fall sports named to the team. The break down between sports was five football players, three men's golfers, three soccer players, three volleyball players, and one women's golfer.

The football team members were Ben Aho, a sophomore wide receiver from Cokato, MN; Trevor Berneking, a senior defensive lineman from Grand Marais, MN; Troy Berneking, a senior linebacker from Grand Marais, MN; Nate Emery, a sophomore linebacker from Coon Rapids, MN; and Guy Rodrique, a wide receiver from Braham, MN.

# Four of the Top Stories from 2003

## WAR IN IRAQ

After months of ultimatums and military buildup, President Bush announced the start of the war against Iraq on March 19. U.S. and British forces quickly seized huge swaths of territory, and by April 7 much of Baghdad was overtaken. Saddam Huessin was captured December 13.



## COLUMBIA DISASTER

The shuttle crew's 16-day research mission ended 16 minutes short of touchdown on February 1 when the Columbia disintegrated into fiery debris over Texas. Investigators later said the cause was a chunk of foam insulation that broke off the fuel tank and pierced the left wing on launch day.

## SARS

The first unsettling reports emerged from Asia in February of a new, unnamed disease. Within a few weeks, SARS was a household name. Cases of severe acute respiratory syndrome spread to more than 25 countries in North America, South America, Europe and Asia. About 8,000 people were infected; roughly 780 died, though health experts generally were pleased with efforts to control the outbreak.



## ELIZABETH SMART

Nine months after she was abducted from her bedroom in Salt Lake City, 15-year-old Elizabeth Smart was found in March in a nearby suburb in the company of a homeless couple who now face kidnapping and sexual assault charges. By Autumn, Elizabeth was back in school, and the subject of a made-for-TV movie.

## RECIPE

### Chocolate Fudgy Bars

- |                              |   |
|------------------------------|---|
| 3 cups quick cooking oats    | 2 eggs                                    |
| 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour | 4 teaspoons vanilla extract               |
| 1 teaspoon baking soda       | 1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk |
| 1 teaspoon salt              | 1 1/2 cups semisweet chocolate chips      |
| 1 cup butter, softened       | 2 tablespoons butter                      |
| 2 cups packed brown sugar    | 1/2 teaspoon salt                         |

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease a 9 x 13 inch baking pan.
2. In a large bowl, beat together 1 cup butter and brown sugar until fluffy. Mix in eggs and 2 teaspoons vanilla. In another bowl, combine oats, flour, baking soda, and 1 teaspoon salt; stir into butter mixture. Set aside.
3. In a medium saucepan, heat sweetened condensed milk, chocolate chips, 2 tablespoons butter, and 1/2 teaspoon salt over low heat, stirring until smooth. Remove from heat. Stir in 2 teaspoons vanilla.
4. Pat 2/3 of the oat mixture into the bottom of the prepared pan. Spread chocolate mixture evenly over the top, and dot with remaining oat mixture.
5. Bake for 30 to 35 minutes in preheated oven. Let cool, then cut into bars.
